

**COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS
GENERAL ELECTION
NOVEMBER 8, 2022**

The Ozaukee County Board of Canvass met Tuesday, November 15, 2022 in Room 118 of the Administration Center for the purpose of canvassing the November 8, 2022 General Election.

Meeting called to order 8:01 am.

Present: County Clerk Winkelhorst, Patti Spencer, Carol Boettcher and Chief Deputy County Clerk Lisa Henning.

County Clerk Winkelhorst reviewed the steps taken to prepare for the County Board of Canvassers. The Board of Canvass accepted the information.

There are no registered write-in candidates for the Ozaukee County races. The registered write-in candidates for Governor, United States Senator and Representative in Congress, District 6 are listed on the write-in tally sheets and the valid write-in votes received for each reporting unit have been tallied. County Clerk Winkelhorst explained that votes for nonregistered write-in candidates in offices where there is no ballot candidate or a ballot candidate is deceased must be recorded on the tally sheets. All votes for nonregistered write-in candidates remain in "scattering".

The following are the findings, by reporting unit, of the Board of Canvassers upon review of the election results.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 1177 ballots. The poll books were reconciled – 1178 voters. It is believed that one (1) voter was issued a voter # and a ballot and failed to place the ballot in the ICE machine.

Town of Fredonia:

ICE - 1210 Voter List – 1210

The Inspectors' Statement indicates that three (3) absentee ballots were rejected as the ballots were received on November 8 but not by the voter. Prior to the Board of Canvass meeting, County Clerk Winkelhorst contacted the chief inspector and the town clerk for clarification. The town clerk clarified that one (1) ballot was returned by another person due to the voter's disability and the remaining two (2) did not qualify to be returned by someone other than the voter. County Clerk Winkelhorst presented this

information to the County Board of Canvassers and the Board determined that the one (1) absentee ballot should not have been rejected. The Board of Canvassers opened the Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) which contained four (4) ballots. The ballot, which was incorrectly rejected, will be counted. The voter was assigned voter #1211 in the poll book. Candidate totals were adjusted accordingly. The Town Clerk will be notified to be sure the voter is given voter participation in WisVote. The Board of Canvassers placed the ballot into a ballot bag and sealed with tamper evident seal #00106283. The remaining rejected absentee ballots were placed into a new Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) and sealed.

The Board of Canvassers questioned the reason for one (1) of the rejected ballots as the explanation written was not clear. The Board of Canvassers opened the Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) to review the application/certification envelope (EL-122) to determine the exact reason for rejection to be certain the ballot was rejected correctly. The Board of Canvassers determined the ballot was rejected correctly and resealed the application/certification envelopes in a new Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102).

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 1004 ballots. A voter registered and was assigned a voter # and voted. The voter was directed back to registration to address an address issue. The election inspector was unaware the voter had already voted and inadvertently issued another voter #. The voter did not receive a second ballot. Total number of ballots equals total number of voters.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 1076 ballots. One (1) voter from Ward 4 inadvertently received a Ward 6 ballot.

The City of Cedarburg has one (1) polling place for its seven (7) wards. The total number of ballots equals the total number of voters for the polling place: 7,246.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 1222 ballots. The poll books were reconciled: 1222 voters. The City Clerk was contacted for clarification on the manual count of the ballots and confirmed the manual count of 1222 ballots. At one point, the machine kicked out two (2) absentee ballots while being processed; however, the election inspectors heard the tabulator "ding" as if one ballot was counted. The election inspectors then deposited both ballots back in the machine individually. The explanation is that when the machine kicked out the two ballots and were then fed back in the machine, a ballot was counted twice.
