CJCC Draft Meeting Minutes

The Criminal Justice Collaborating Council met in Room 240 of the Ozaukee County Justice Center on Monday May 8th from 1:30pm-2:30pm.

Call to Order/Proper Notice/Adoption of Agenda:

Chair Liza Drake called the meeting to order at 1:32pm.

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Rhonda to approve the February 13th, 2023, meeting minutes as submitted. The motion was seconded by Sheriff Knowles.

Coordinator Report:

The coalitions are working on the objectives in the CHIP report. Two subgroups: treatment and support and education and awareness. Treatment and support subgroup is working on a one-page resources list to be able to hand out at events and put on partner websites. This page will give people a brief and condensed version of our substance use toolkit. Education and awareness subgroup is working on spending the SOR grant they received. They are looking at doing a fentanyl awareness campaign.

Change the ending campaign was officially adopted in Ozaukee County. It's a substance use and mental health website that Washington County created where people answer a short three question survey and then are given a list of resources that the county offers based on the needs of that individual. The health department is paying for it to be in both counties now. They are hoping to re-launch with Ozaukee on the website this week. Stay tuned for more updates.

Financial Report:

We looked at two proposals that were submitted by human services and the sheriff's office. Please see attached proposals. The treatment proposal (sheriff's office) was put on hold until we can get more information about what they are looking for. The pocket guide proposal (human services) was discussed and voted on. Unanimous voting took place, and it was approved to spend the money for the pocket guides. Sheriff Knowles made a motion to approve and Chris Minneti 2nd the motion.

TAD Program

Sirona has hired a new TAD coordinator who will be starting on June 20th. She comes with years of experience as a guidance director and counseling at the high school level. The TAD program was presented to the police chiefs and

the TAD referral form was sent out. Sirona is hoping to see some referrals come through from the police departments. Please make sure you are sending referrals to both DA Gerol and Melissa Drews of Sirona Recovery.

Program Graduations vs. Termination Rates to Date

- 116 total program graduations (67%): successfully completed all program conditions throughout the monitoring period
- 61 total non-compliance terminations (33%): majority of terminations due to positive drug tests

Recidivism Rates of Discharged cases: all present & past programs

207 total program participant discharges – includes both graduations & terminations

Diversion/DPA

- 170 total discharged cases to date
 - o 117 successful completions; 61 terminations
- 113 former participants have not committed additional crimes since discharge (64%)
- 65 former participants have committed additional crimes since discharge (36%)
 - o **Only 4 participants recidivated post-successful discharge from the program**

ATR

- 37 total discharged cases to date
 - o 17 successful completions; 20 terminations
- 20 former participants have not committed additional crimes since discharge (54%)
- 16 former participants have committed additional crimes since discharge (46%)
 - o **Only 5 participants recidivated post-successful discharge from the program**

PSA Video Clips:

We discussed the 4 video clips that EPIC creative sent over regarding the PSA they are creating for CJCC. Everyone loved the clips. There are 4 different PSAs that depict 4 different situations and 1 of them is a positive outcome.



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CJCC Updates:

There was discussion around adding the health department as a voting member. They would be beneficial because substance use, and criminal justice can be a public health issue and the health department could bring valuable information to these meetings. It was unanimously voted to add public health as a member. A motion to approve was made by Rhonda Gordon and Heather Dvoran 2nd it. This rule is effective immediately and public health is now officially a voting member.

Probation and Parole is handing out Narcan and Fentanyl test strips to their clients. Been successful so far and hoping to be able to hand out more once people get more comfortable. The Narcan comes in a kit of 2 and the fentanyl test strips come with 4 strips, a vial of water and directions on how to use it. They also have a naloxzone box in the lobby.

Public Comment

Deputy Carter's Pre-trial supervision program is going well. There are 4 participants. Looking to possibly get some funding to help individuals who can not pay for parts of the program.
