17 **MEETING MINUTES**

20 **COMMUNICABLE DISEASE REPORT**

21 Ms. Buechler reported that pertussis and seasonal virus cases are trending down. Although there
22 hasn't been a measles case in Wisconsin, the Communicable Disease team at the health
23 department has been working on preparing our response plan.

27 **WIC PROGRAM REPORT**

28 Ms. Buechler reported that WIC participation reached an all-time high in the month of April. The
29 WIC team has been preparing for their annual Community Connections event in June. WIC is
30 unsure if participants will be receiving farmers' market vouchers this year due to funding, but we
31 should receive more information on this soon. Ms. Buechler also reported that WIC is bringing
32 back monthly in-person group education classes for WIC participants.

34 **PUBLIC HEALTH DIRECTOR UPDATES**

35 Ms. Buechler discussed the 2026-2030 Community Health Improvement Plan survey and
36 explained how the feedback received from the community will be used to help develop the plan.

38 Health department staff attended outreach events at the Casa Guadalupe Multicultural Center, as
39 well as the annual Cops and Kids event where they provided resource information to the public.

41 Ms. Buechler reported the health department semiannual staff retreat was held at Lime Kiln Park
42 in Grafton that included training on emergency preparedness, measles preparation, and team
43 building exercises.

45 Ms. Buechler provided an update regarding the upcoming budget kickoff meeting and that the
46 health department was looking to maintain a flat levy.

1 Lastly, Ms. Buechler explained that the health department will be starting the accreditation
2 readiness process in the next few months.

4 **2024 ANNUAL REPORT**

5 Ms. Buechler presented a summary of the 2024 annual report which highlighted foundational
6 public health services, an organizational chart breakdown, employee engagement, office
7 remodel, department achievements, program areas, expanded services, and coalition
8 accomplishments.

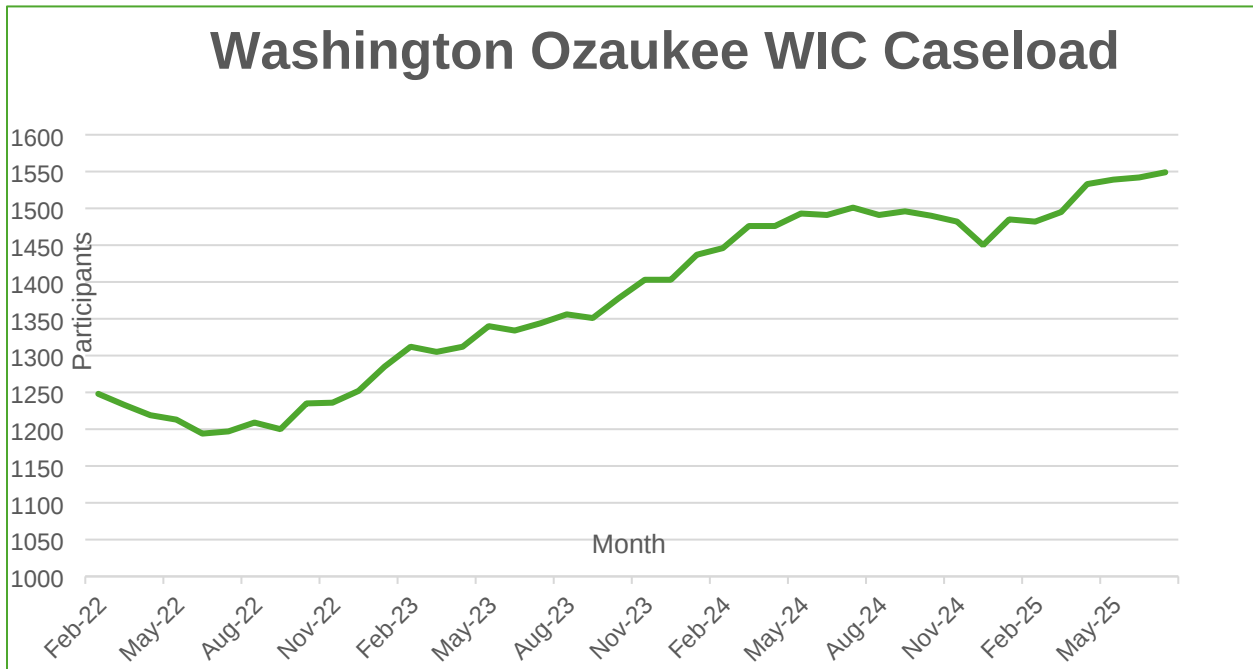

Breastfeeding Reports

- State WIC office Epidemiologist is currently updating the breastfeeding data and reporting
- Now Annual data is updated quarterly until it is final. Final data is run at the start of the year that is 2 years after the report year (ex. 2023 report is final in early 2025). This is to capture all infants in all feeding categories in a given year.
- Report Highlights 2024:
 - Washington Ozaukee WIC (BFQ2001-2):
 - All Infants Ever Breastfed: 83.4% - Statewide Comparison 76.5%
 - Moms on WIC Prenatally: 89.2% - Statewide Comparison 78.3%
 - Mom's on WIC prenatally who ever breastfed (BFQ2001-3):
 - Ozaukee: 91.2%
 - Washington: 83.2%
 - State: 78.3%

News from WIC

- Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act: July 2025, the USDA published a notice in the Federal Register related to the interpretation of the 1996 Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) and eligibility for “public benefit programs.” The notice reiterates that **states have the option** to restrict participation in certain USDA programs, including WIC, for some immigrants, but they are not required to do so. This option has been in place since 1996 and remains unchanged. Wisconsin WIC is not changing any of our eligibility requirements, meaning we are not requiring proof of citizenship to access services – State WIC Director update
- WIC grant is currently fully funded for 2025. Washington Ozaukee WIC has reached a record high participant caseloads with 1549 participants enrolled in July 2025. This is attributed to increase recruitment efforts through HMO leads as well as retention of currently enrolled participants.
- The 2025 Farmers’ Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) grant had funding changes this year. Our agency received 75% of typically allocated checks, and the dollar amount was reduced to \$25/booklet per participant. In addition, the vouchers were not available until July this year, so we were not able to distribute at our Community Connections event in June.
- WIC Director, Missy Lacy will be presenting at the virtual National WIC Association conference early September (currently pending abstract proposal approval process). *How Wisconsin WIC Modernized and Streamlined Breast Pump Management and Issuance*. She will be highlighting her contributions as content creator for Instagram (IG) and TikTok in collaboration with Wisconsin WIC Strong featuring educational content related to breastfeeding back to work, breast pumps, LIVE Q&A’s and IG story updates.
